

DIGITAL IMAGING SIG ON MONDAY FEBRUARY 23, 2009

Co-leader Carter Harrison led the meeting.

He packed a lot of quality information into a 1 1/2 hour session.

He demonstrated how to set the white balance, allowing an attendee from the audience to try it with his camera. He showed photos taken at the Pima Air and Space Museum and elsewhere, and explained white balance adjustments that were made at each "shoot".

Discussion included a new \$100 program that professionals use when superimposing different objects in a photo. The program which is called SunPath, tells you where the sun is any day, anywhere in the world. Then you can duplicate the angle of light on each photo used in a composite photo. (A composite photo is one that is composed of more than one photo. Carter Harrison uses the composite photo to create photos that are amazing works of art.)
