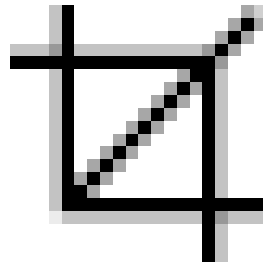
Can import .JPG files into a photo project	Yes

# "Photos" Bundled in "Windows.." Page 2 of 2

Can tilt a photo project either 90 or 180 or 270 degrees	Yes
Can tilt a photo project a specific number of degrees from 0 to 359 degrees	No
Can adjust the brightness of a photo project	Yes
Can adjust the input-output brightness "x-y" curve of a photo project	No
Can adjust the contrast of a photo project	No
Can perform a rectangular crop on a photo project	Yes

# STEPS

- Double-click on a photo
- "Crop" button



- Drop the corners to select the area that is to remain
- Click on "Save a copy" to save the area inside the remaining rectangle to a new photo file



# STEPS

- Double-click on a photo
- "Get creative with this photo" (= two crayons in an x configuration)
- "Edit"
- "Rotate" for 90 degrees at a time
- "Straightening" for x number of degrees of additional rotation

# STEPS (continued)

- Double-click on a photo
- Get creative with this photo (= two crayons in an x configuration)
- Adjustments:  
Light, color, clarity, vignette,  
Scroll downward vertically to get to  
"Red eye" and "Spot fix"

# STEPS (continued)

To save a single frame of a video:

- Click on a VIDEO from inside the "Photos" app
- Click on "Edit & Create"
- Click on "Save photos"
- Move the horizontal slider until the frame that you want to save is shown
- Click on "Save a photo"
- A \*.jpg photo will be saved in the same folder that the video file resides in

# STEPS (continued)

If "Photos" by Microsoft fails to start or "Video Editor" by Microsoft fails to start, you can re-install them both by going to the "Microsoft Store" and then searching for "Microsoft Photos" since both "Photos" and "Video Editor" are listed in the "Microsoft Store" as "Microsoft Photos".

# STEPS (continued)

If you are working inside "Photos" in "Windows 10" and you click on "Video Projects", you will end up inside "Video Editor" which is also by Microsoft and which is also bundled inside "Windows 10"
